
Nutritional Classes

RSVP Stations Remember Veterans (and goats and sheep, too!)

Last December, RSVP stations America's Veteran Supporters and Society of Military Widows (and many volunteers) placed 1,100 wreaths at Fort Sill National Cemetery in Elgin as part of the Wreaths Across America program to remember and honor our veterans.

In January AVS and SMW - joined by Purple Heart and Elgin Middle and High School Student Council - picked up the wreaths after Wreaths Across America. They donated them to Black Dog Farm of Fletcher to feed their goats and sheep!









Black Dog Farm said on Facebook: "We received 1,100 wreaths from Fort Sill cemetery today! Our goats and sheep loved them. The animals eat the needles and bark, and we chip the remainder for bedding. Pine is a natural dewormer for goats and sheep. Research has shown that goats and sheep that are able to forage on pine have up to 30% less egg/worm count. I love finding ways to help keep my flock naturally healthy and not rely so heavily on chemicals and medications! Win-win!"

How to use monthly tracking logs...



Volunteer Tracking (Yellow) – individual volunteers can "self" track all their hours at one or multiple stations and turn hours in to RSVP Office each month.

Station Tracking (Blue) – Station supervisors are provided with these sheets to track ALL volunteer hours at their site and turn into RSVP office each month.





Travel Reimbursement Claim (Green) – volunteers may claim travel reimbursement once the notify the RSVP office, and have updated DL & Auto Insurance card on file. This sheet tracks volunteer hours and odometer readings and <u>must be signed off by the station supervisor</u> and turned into RSVP office each month.

All forms are located outside the RSVP office, or you may download off our City website.
