You can take a "book walk" by turning the pages & pointing to pictures while naming them to help build your child's vocabulary. If your child wants to look at the same pictures over & over, give them time to do so. Children need repetition to store information in their long-term memories. Take time to look at & read books with your little one. It will create a strong tradition of reading in their lives.




