

Lap-time fun exploration for infants & toddlers using rhymes, bounces, fingerplays, & songs that promote school readiness skills.




#### MONTHLY CONCEPT

There are hanger arms to allow users to hang their bike so that the wheels can spin freely while making adjustments. A bike pump is also be available for cyclists needing to air up their tires.
