WE ARE HERE TO HELP

OPEN WITH LIMITED SERVICES

The main library is open regular hours. Due to occupancy limits, please limit your time in the library. Group gatherings are not allowed at this time; the children's play area is not available.



COMPUTER LAB

The Computer Lab is open at half capacity. Computers are disinfected between users.



FACE COVERINGS

Face coverings are encouraged for your safety & ours. Often used surfaces are being regularly disinfected. Returned materials are also being wiped down.



CURBSIDE PICKUP
